"WE'RE GONNA BE RICH!" by Ronnie Scherffius

The story is told of two brothers who went into the hills of Montana to hunt ▲ wolves. They had heard the rumor that an organization in the state was offering a bounty of five thousand dollars for every wolf captured alive. Day and night they searched the mountains and forests searching for their valuable prey. Exhausted, after three days of hunting without any success, they decided to camp for the night and quickly fell asleep.

"My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing."

James 1:2-4

During the night, one brother awoke with a start. What he found would make most men cry like a baby; they were surrounded by a pack of at least fifty

wolves each with flaming red eyes and bared teeth, snarling at the two hunters and ready

to attack. Undaunted, he nudged his brother and said with excitement, "Wake up! We're gonna be rich!"

Sometimes when we are surrounded by what appears to be, and in fact may be, great difficulties, we fail to realize that in the greater scheme of things we may in fact be surrounded by many opportunities. Did you know that the Chinese symbol for the word crisis actually combines the two words danger and opportunity. When great difficulties come our way we can choose to be frightened and cowardly, or we can stand fast and be strong and courageous.

To the Corinthians saints Paul declared, "Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong" (1 Cor. 16:13 - ASV).

Yet, it is not in our own wisdom that we should trust, neither is it in our own strength that we should depend. Paul admonished the Galatians, "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith **Christ hath made us free**" (Gal. 5:1), and to the soldiers of Calvary's cross in Ephesus he instructed, "be strong in the Lord, and in the power of **his might**" (Eph. 6:10).

The trials and tribulations of this earth serve to prepare us for heaven by causing us to long for and greatly desire that heavenly abode. How much greater will we enjoy and appreciate that which "eye hath not seen" (1 Cor. 2:9)! Though difficulties may cause some to lose faith, if we keep our focus on Christ and our heavenly prize, and allow hard times to temper our faith we will see the riches rather than the struggles. So, the next time you're facing a pack of wolves remember, "You're gonna be rich!"
